#GrowServeInspire!

Webber Middle School's #GrowServeInspire! program utilizes a scaffolded approach to gifted education where Advanced Learning Plans (ALPs) are met through core classes and complementary activities. Students travel through an academic pathway which provides increasing opportunities for learning, involvement, and responsibility at each grade level:

6th grade: GROW

- Honors English for GT Reading/Writing students (ALP)
- Accelerated Math pathway for GT Math students (ALP)
- Weekly Genius Hour workshop for Creativity students (ALP)
- Participation in Webber clubs, activities, and elective courses
- Academic "pop up" groups per student interest

7th grade: SERVE

...and

- Small group service learning opportunities correlated to areas of academic interests (ALP)
- Opportunity to travel on annual international service learning trip
- Opportunity to apply for Webber GT student leadership team

8th grade: INSPIRE

...and

- Honors Science 8 for GT Math/Science students (ALP)
- Opportunity to develop and design long-term passion project with support of community mentor (ALP)
- Presentation at annual 8th grade GT Showcase (ALP)
