Equine Therapy

Throughout this semester, Unbridled Farm has worked with a group of students from Webber Middle School to aid in problem-solving skills that will help them excel in school, develop skills to manage home life, and help with finding positive ways to cope with other potential issues that many teenagers face every day. The kids have been introduced to these skills using horses as a therapeutic tool.

The method used at Unbridled Farm follows the EAGALA (Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association) model. EAGALA is a program that encourages personal development and uses the horse as a metaphor for different personal life events. The non-verbal connection between the students and the horses is an effective therapeutic technique that is very focused on self-discovery. EAGALA is unique because it can make a huge positive impact in mental and/or physical aspects that the client wants to work on.

This equine therapy has been a powerful tool in helping these children and we look forward to continuing this partnership in the years to come.

Dress Code Reminders

As the weather gets warmer, we want to remind you of our school dress code. When you come to school, you are coming to your place of work – or your job. From the Health Office

End of the Year Medication Pickup Medications cannot be sent home with students at the end of the school year.

- Parents must pick up all medications on or before 11:30 AM on the last day of school (5/30/2019). REMINDER: the last day of school is a half day.
- If medications need to be picked up before the last day of school, make arrangements with the school nurse or health tech.
- Emergency or as-needed medications (Epi-pens, Tylenol, Inhalers, etc.) must also be picked up, please make a plan with your school health office.
- The school nurse will follow state health department procedures and dispose of all medications not picked up by parent/guardian by 11:30 AM on 5/30/19.
- If medications will be brought back to the school in the fall, you may obtain a medical authorization form from the health tech in your school, or on the PSD website. If you have any questions, please contact your school nurse or health tech.

Fine for lost or damaged charger cord: \$20 Fine for keyboard damage or missing keyboard frame: \$20


These fines will be added to the student's SchoolPay account and can be paid along with other fines & fees.

Solar Car Team

Our inaugural Webber Solar Car Team had a great showing at the Regional Junior Solar Sprint Competition at Walt Clark Middle School in Loveland on Saturday, April 13th. Nitro Kitty a LiPo battery car designed by Sofia A. and Emily M. won BEST IN SHOW for their clever design and 4th place in speed. The Solar Powered Panther car designed by Charlie W., Ivan A-G., Caleb M, and Gavin M. won 3rd place in speed. The fastest car of the entire event and the first place winner was Solar Hijinx Integrated Technology designed by Webber's own Maddie Beard, Jared Martindale, and Abbigail Smith. Coach Kearns and Coach Over were very impressed and proud of our student' achievements.

Students on the team spent the last two months designing and constructing vehicles that run on solar energy and lithium-ion polymer battery power. Students designed cars to be lightweight, fast and innovative. The cars needed to travel 20 meters down a neoprene surface racing against three others cars in a heat. The students were given three trials to achieve the fastest possible time. Our school was sponsored by The Platte River Power Authority and the City of Fort Collins Utilities Department.

Eight teams from Webber will move on to the state event on Saturday, May 4th at Dakota Ridge HS in Denver. The state event is sponsored by the National Renewable Energy Lab and at that event students will compete for trophies and prize money against students from all over Colorado. 

Beyond Consequences & Advanced Parenting Skills Class

Beyond Consequences is a unique, relationship-based approach to parenting traumatized children and those with attachment challenges. This approach provides a trauma-informed explanation of "acting out" behaviors. Caregivers will learn how children escalate through behaviors, as well as how to respond to help their children during these times. When children and caregivers expand their ability to emotionally tolerate stressful situations, behavior naturally improves. The class is appropriate for biological parents, adoptive parents, foster parents, and kinship-care providers.

Some Program Topics

- Emotional regulation and dysregulation
 - Window of stress tolerance
 - Trauma and memory
- Acting out behaviors, i.e. lying, stealing, aggression, etc.
 - Signs and stages of verbal and behavioral escalation
 - Caregiver responses to decrease escalation
 - Setting appropriate and enforceable limits
