Required classes for every general education 6th grader are as follows: English/Language Arts 6 and Math (meets daily) Science 6 and Social Studies 6 (meets every other day) Physical Education 6 (one semester only)

6th graders are also introduced to a quarterly rotation of electives. They will have the opportunity to experience the following classes:

Art Activity and Appreciation, Web 2.0 Technology, Intro to Technology, Family and Consumer Sciences, and World Language Explorations

Notes: If a student is not at a proficient level in reading, he/she may be placed in English/Language Arts 6 Strategic (Reading Literacy, a year-long class) in place of four of the quarter elective classes or yearlong elective. For students who are not proficient or passing all core classes, we may provide support through a content specific study hall. G/T students will be placed in Eng/Lang Arts 6 Honors.

6th Grade Elective Choice Course Descriptions

Quarter Long Elective Choices:

<u>Music Explorations 6</u>: Exploration of different musical styles and development of skills that is basic to musical understanding and appreciation. Music exploration performance is limited to class.

OR

<u>Choir 6</u>: In 6th Grade beginning choir, we learn the basics of vocal technique, music theory, and performance. This class is rehearsal based and we practice then perform songs from various genres and time periods. Beginning choir provides a strong choral foundation that allows students to confidently transition to choir in seventh and eighth grade. Attendance at the 6th grade performance for that quarter is required as part of student's grade.

Year Long Elective Choices:

Band 6: Beginning Band is designed for teaching basic skills to beginning Wind, Brass and Percussion players. Tone, technical facility, music terminology and music reading are stressed through a variety of music literature. Enrollment is based upon completion of the Summer Band Program or by approval of the instructor. If the student is not able to attend the Summer Band Program, he/she should contact the instructor at the middle school they will attend. Attendance at performances is required as a part of the student's grade. (Instruments include flute, clarinet, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone, tuba, and percussion (drum and bells)). Oboe, bassoon, bass clarinet and saxophone all require a student to begin on clarinet. ***

Orchestra 6: Beginning Orchestra is designed for teaching basic skills to beginning Violin, Viola, Cello and Bass players. Tone, technical facility, music terminology and music reading are stressed through a variety of music literature. Enrollment is based upon completion of the Summer Music Program or by approval of the instructor. If student is not able to attend the Summer Music Program, he/she should contact the instructor at the middle school they will attend. Attendance at performances is required as a part of the student's grade. Harp requires student to begin on violin or cello, and/or private lessons. ***

<u>ELO - Extended Learning Opportunity:</u> This four-quarter enrichment program includes <u>all</u> of the following:

- **Sports and games -**From volleyball to dodgeball, and putt-putt golf to Uno, this class focuses on wellness with mental and physical activities.
- **Don't Judge a Book by its Cover!** -Different than just a "book club", this class will give you time to explore your favorite books, stories, and poems in unique ways, making creative art projects, skits, and more.
- Know Thyself -Learn about yourself and build self-awareness through activities, projects and speakers.
- Animal Science -Introduces students to the Kingdom of Animalia. Students may learn about various topics including animal classification, tracks and scat, threatened and endangered species, animal behavior and systems including virtual and real dissection opportunities.

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
